



## Participant “Snapshot”

- i. If Participant is sick or displays symptoms of COVID-19, please **STAY HOME**
- ii. Maximum sixty-eight (68) car field by **Pre-Registration**.
- iii. At this time all Teams will need to unload in the infield every day.
- iv. ALL Drivers **MUST** be current DIRTcar Members by Pre-Registration.
- v. **While at the event we strongly recommend ALL Participants wear a cloth Face cover at ALL times.**
- vi. Overnight Camping is available, though nearly full. You must call or check-in at the Knoxville Office to get your spot. All spots are on a first-come, first-served basis and must be reserved prior to the event.
- vii. You **MUST** exercise CDC Guidelines, including social-distancing (6' separation between groups) and **NO** groups larger than ten (10), while in the campground area. Failure to do so will require implementation of a curfew each evening.
- viii. **Participants will NOT be allowed to enter the Pit Area before 2pm on Thursday.** You **MUST** be in the Facility by 5pm. Personal vehicles will **NOT** be permitted in the Pit Area, but can park in the Old Pamida Lot across Larson Street located off the backstretch. **On Friday & Saturday (Day 2&3) the pits will be secured at 3pm, pit sales will begin and COVID-19 Screening will start for Re-Entry. This event will have a 3-day wristband.**
- ix. Upon arrival to the Facility you should be prepared for a COVID-19 Screening up to and including taking a Temperature Test.
- x. Pit Passes **DO NOT** grant you access to the Grandstands. You **MUST** have a ticket.
- xi. ALL Attendees **MUST follow CDC Guidelines** throughout the entire event from entry onto the facility until exit up to and including Social-Distancing (6' separation) outside your Pit area. It is recommended for you to wear cloth face cover outside your Pit Area to protect yourself and others.
- xii. **If you choose to leave your Pit Area it is strongly recommended to wear a cloth face cover.**
- xiii. World of Outlaws Official will execute Pill Draw at Command Center. Transponders, if needed, will be available at the same time. **ONLY** one (1) representative per team.
- xiv. Maintain Social-Distancing in your designated Work Area...cloth face covers are **NOT** required.
- xv. **Cloth face covers are required during Pre-Race Ceremonies, the Dash Draw and Victory Lane.** Mask can be removed for individual photos during Victory Lane.

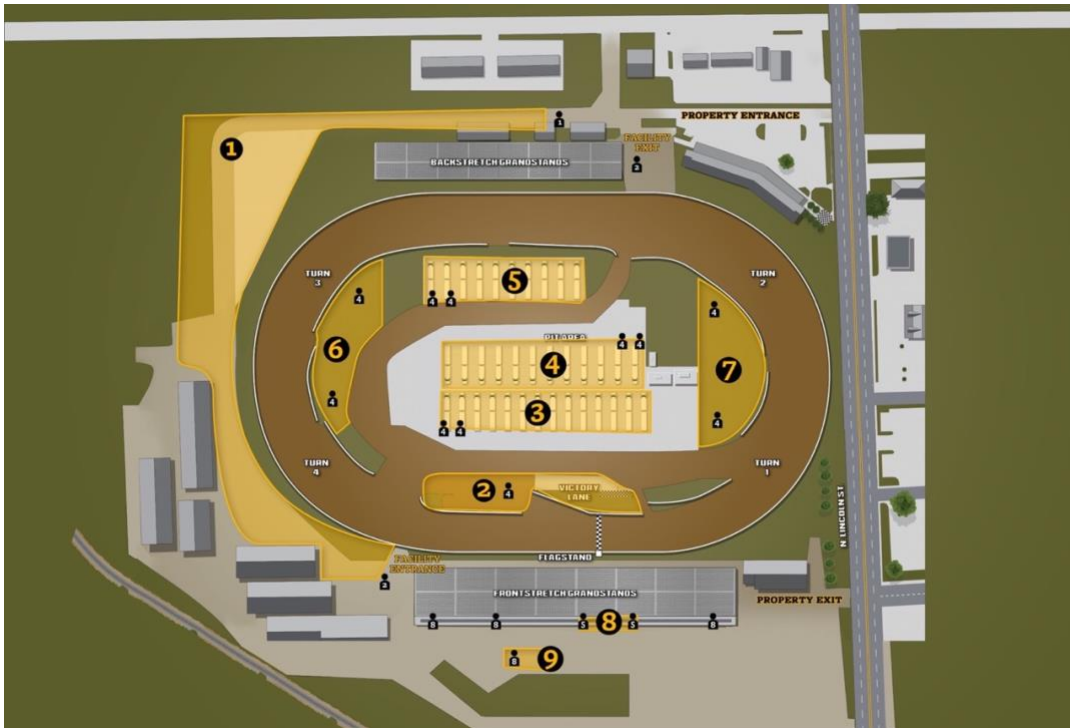
